Traveling to CUA

Pangborn Hall

Our building, Pangborn Hall is just 100 yards from the Brookland-CUA Red Line metro station.

Conference Room

The meeting will be held in the Scullen Room, which is near the front entrance of Pangborn Hall. The room can be found by walking down the first hallway to the right from the main entrance. The room should easily accommodate about 50 people.

Acoustics and Vibrations Lab – B16

The lab is also in Pangborn Hall two levels down on the ground level from the Scullen Room. The room number is B16.

DC Metro - Red Line

People are strongly encouraged to use metro. The Red line station is about 100 yards from our building. Our stop is called Brookland-CUA.
